

Improving Indigenous Inclusion in Health Care: My Healing Journey Post NICU Discharge

This session is presented by Stephanie Antone and will highlight her experiences advocating for medical care for her infant daughter. Stephanie has had an extensive neonatal journey. Her daughter, Yehati was born in 2010 at 25 weeks gestation, carrying a rare gene that causes cataracts at birth. This session will focus on Yehati's story and address issues of health care access for Indigenous children.



Stephanie Antone is a Cree-Metis mother of two. Her grandparents are from Fort Chipewyan (Mikisew) (Treaty 8) and Driftpile Cree First Nation. She is proud to be the daughter of Linda McNamara, retired LPN. Stephanie grew up off reserve, yet actively maintains connections to family and her culture through participating in ceremony and dance. She has lived in Calgary for over ten years. She has travelled all over Turtle Island on the powwow trail. She is a champion woman's fancy dancer and jingle dress dancer. Passionate about politics and justice, she advocates for her daughter who is legally blind and brings her unique perspective as an Indigenous parent. Stephanie has over 8 years of parental experience at Alberta Children's Hospital and is passionate about her culture.
