Alberta Indigenous populations: facilitating successful partnerships in cancer research & strategy building



This session is presented by Dr. Angeline Letendre, who is a scientist at the Alberta Cancer Prevention Legacy Fund. Angeline has a background in nursing, obtained her doctorate through cervical cancer research with Cree and Cree-Metis women in Alberta, and has worked with Indigenous health experts from across Canada using Indigenous research methodologies.

Angeline has a proven track record in facilitating successful research partnerships with Indigenous communities in Alberta, in areas concerning cancer and cancer prevention. Dr. Letendre is also Research Chair/Treasurer for the Canadian Indigenous Nurses Association and has recently been elected international co-chair for the second World Indigenous Cancer Conference which is set to be co-hosted by Alberta Health Services in Calgary, Alberta, September 17-19, 2019.

1. Identify principles in developing research partnerships with Indigenous populations .
2. Describe models, resources and tools that have been developed to establish partnerships and processes in doing cancer research with First Nations and Metis communities.
3. Provide examples of research partnerships with First Nations and Metis Settlement communities in Alberta .
4. Host an open dialogue around the challenges in creating an Alberta Indigenous cancer strategy .
