
Appreciating Water Spirit and the Complexities of Water Projects in Community April 11, 2024 1:30-3:00pm MST

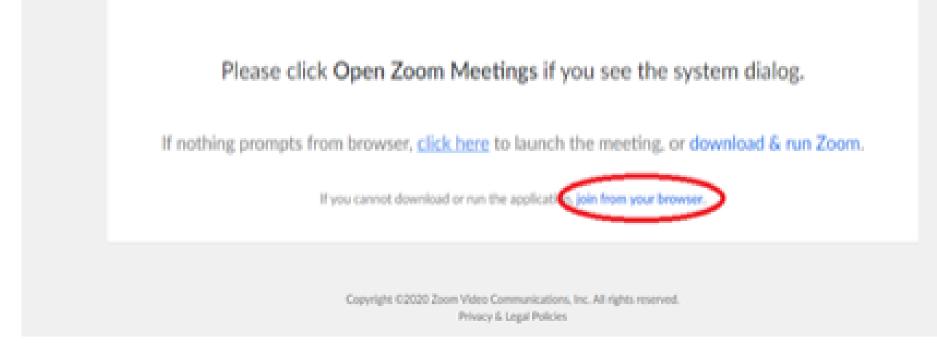
