

# Using CHIP SLICE School Age Report to Organize Your School Program

The updated SLICE School Age Report can be used to identify students age 10-17 who need immunization through the school program and create consent call lists. The report now reflects true complete/incomplete series status by antigen for each client. Use the new Export feature for desktop management of Excel lists, which can be printed and used to organize parental consent processes.



## Learning Outcomes:

- Learn how to identify students who are incomplete for school vaccines
- Learn to interpret records flagged as Ineffective Doses or Possible False Records, and how these affect Complete Series Status for clients
- Understand how to use the new Export function efficiently create parental consent lists

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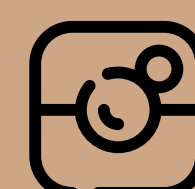


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
