

Key Terms

Continuing Care Home (CCH)

 CCH means a facility or part of a facility where facilitybased care is provided to residents, some of whom must be eligible residents.

Home and Community Care (HCC)

 HCC means the prescribed health goods and services and prescribed other goods and services that are provided by a home and community care provider to an eligible individual in the individual's home or community but does not include facility-based care or supportive living services.

Key Terms

Coordinated Access

 Coordinated access is the framework that guides continuity of care, improves access to information, supports system navigation and ensures all individuals have access to case management services.

Waitlist Management

 Waitlist management includes the required processes to fairly and equitably prioritize the waitlist for CCHs, prioritize capacity across the health system and manage CCH vacancy.

Waitlist

 The waitlist is a prioritized list of patients waiting for admission to a CCH who have been assessed and approved.

Key Terms

Comprehensive Assessment

• Comprehensive assessment is a compilation of the standardized assessment and all secondary assessments.

Standardized Assessment

• In Alberta, the interRAI suite of tools are used as the standardized assessment and screening tool. Assessment for CCH requires completion of the RAI-HC or interRAI HC.

Secondary Assessment

 Secondary assessments are completed when indicated by the standardized assessment either due to screening or other outcomes.

Purpose of the Guide

Supports consistency of information sharing

Reduces artificial barriers to access within Alberta such as zone or community boundaries

Provides a consistent process for moves from another jurisdiction within Canada

Why did we develop the Supporting Transitions in Care Guide?

Expanded on existing processes to improve access to CCH for First Nations community members

Developed a consistent provincial process for accessing a CCH from another Canadian jurisdiction
