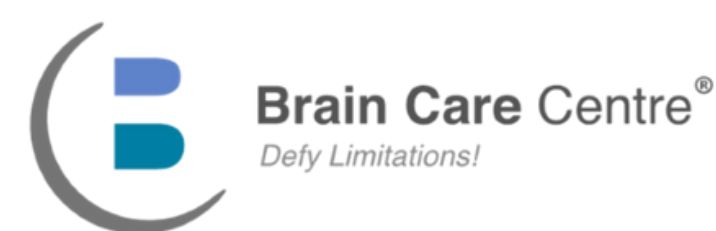
## Learning Outcomes:

Aside from individualized occupational therapy, Kailey also facilitates group sessions and BCC's Concussion Recovery Program.

**Shayna Scarpino, MC (she/her);** Support Facilitator. Working towards her Provisional Psychologist registration, Shayna has been with Brain Care Centre for the past year. In her work with Brain Care Centre, Shayna facilitates the Mental Health portion of the online Concussion Recovery Program, as well as multiple support groups and classes including the Caregiver Support Group, Concussion Support Group, and Understanding Brain Injury.
