Food is Sacred: Eating During Cancer

This session explores nutrition supports available for individuals affected by cancer, with a focus on culturally respectful care. Participants will learn how to recognize common nutrition-related side effects, access resources, and connect patients with dietitians and educational tools. The session also highlights the deeper meaning of food—its traditional, cultural, and emotional significance—and how honoring these aspects can support healing, connection, and dignity during cancer care.

- Understand how food can support emotional well-being, cultural identity, and meaningful moments for patients and families

She has over 10 years of experience in nutrition care, adult learning, and health literacy. Stephanie's work supports people affected by cancer through nutrition resources that go beyond nutrients—helping individuals and families feel confident in making meals, navigating food challenges, and finding comfort and connection through eating. She focuses on creating resources that are easy to understand, respectful, and reflect people's different life experiences

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
