

Establishing Actionable Community-Specific Primary Care Quality Measures through Provincial Data Linkage

In 2025, OKAKI worked with university, government, and First Nations partners to establish an initial set of community-specific primary care quality indicators, with a focus on diabetes care. These community-specific reports were created by linking each organization's CHIP/CARE client registry with multiple provincial health datasets. The next iteration is now open to additional First Nations health centres who wish to participate. The session will provide an overview of the process and share perspectives from the communities who participated in the initial pilot.

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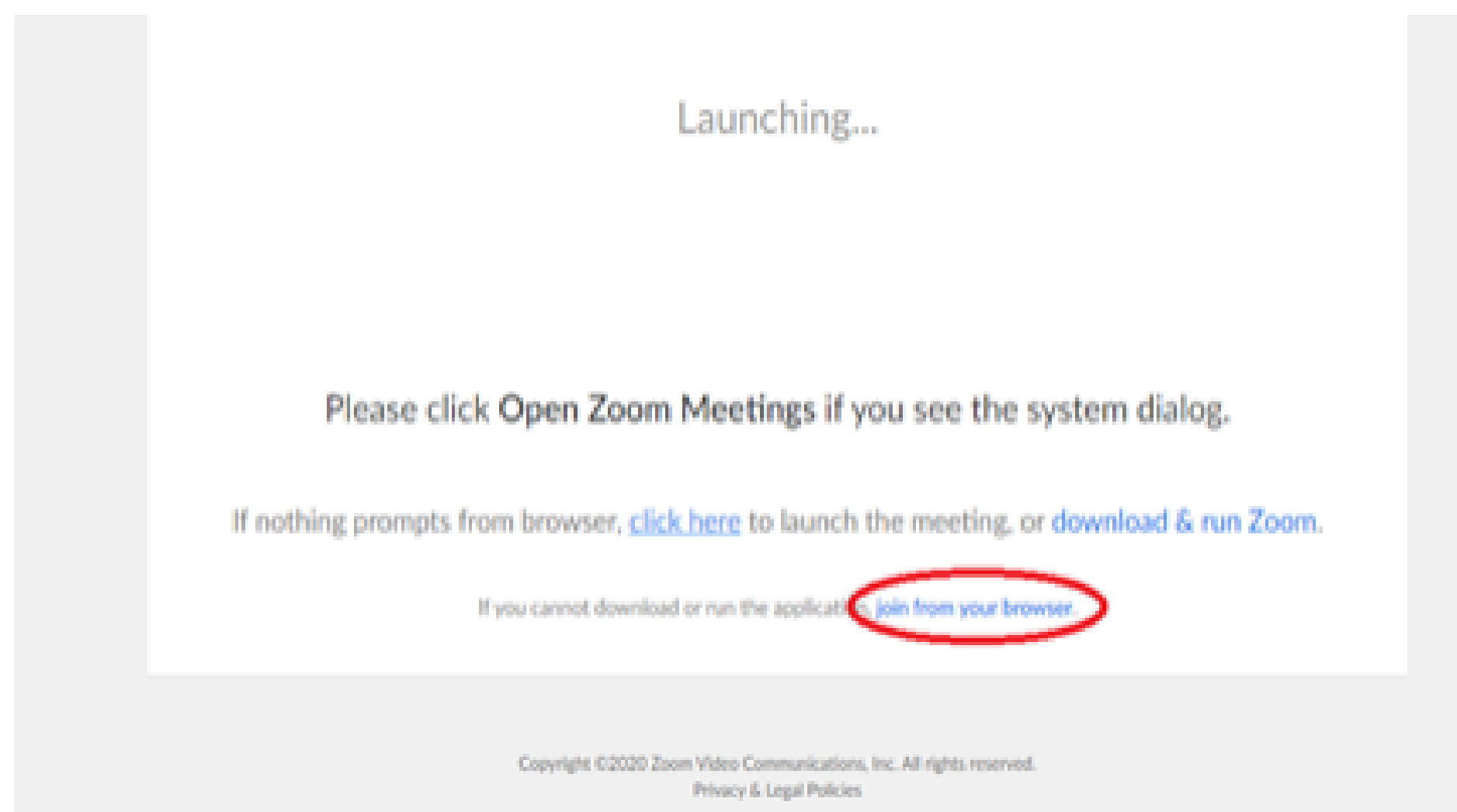
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
